

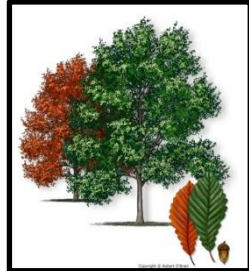


**NEW! Southern arrowwood viburnum *Viburnum dentatum* 2-3' #2 (gal.) container**

Southern arrowwood, also known as Arrowwood viburnum is valued for its durability and utility in the landscape. Ornamental features include white, flat-topped flowers in late spring, blue fruits in September, and wine-red fall color. The native shrub makes a great screen, informal hedge, and is useful in groupings and masses, or as filler in the border. A dense, multi-stemmed, rounded shrub reaching 6 to 10 feet high and 6 to 12 feet wide. Full sun (6 hrs direct light daily), Partial sun/shade (4-6 hrs light daily). The late fruiting season appeals to many species of birds. This plant is also a caterpillar and larval host to the hummingbird moth and a nectar source to red admiral butterflies.

**Pin oak (*Quercus palustris*) 18-24" seedlings**

Fast growing to 60-70' with equal spread. Will tolerate wet and clay soils but prefers moist, well drained acid soil. Full sun. The symmetry is pyramidal and russet, bronze, or red fall color is beautiful. Probably the most widely used native oak for landscaping.



**Swamp white oak *Quercus bicolor* 18-24" seedlings**

An excellent wetland tree which will grow in moist to swampy soils and 50-60' high. Exhibits many of the qualities of the white oak and is an exceptional looking species. The Latin species name *bicolor* refers to the distinctive two-colored appearance of the leaves: green on top surface and whitish on the underside. Unlike other oaks, the dark brown branch bark peels away in eye-catching ragged curls, exposing the lighter bark beneath.

**Sugar maple *Acer saccharum* 18-24" seedlings**

A medium rate growing shade tree to 60-75' with variable bark. Leaves are a brilliant yellow, burnt orange and some red tones in autumn. Prefers moderately moist, fertile soil and sun although it tolerates shade.



**River birch *Betula nigra* 18-24" seedlings**

Fast growing Eastern US native birch for low, swampy, wet areas, but does well in many soils. Adapts well to heavy clay soils. Full sun to part shade. Beautiful reddish/gray-brown exfoliating bark. Resistant to bronze birch borer and very heat tolerant. Very suitable in stream bank erosion control. **Good choice for CREP.**

**BACK AGAIN! Red osier dogwood *Cornus sericea* 3-4' seedlings**

A great, large dogwood shrub with bright red stems showing off well in the winter snow. Berries are white to gray at maturity and a preferred food to wildlife, especially birds and gamebirds. Very easy care.



**NEW! Persimmon *Diospyros virginiana* 12-18" seedlings**

Height 35' to 60'. Does well in difficult, dry soils. Fragrant white flowers in spring yield yellow-orange edible fruit in the fall. Wildlife like the fruit. Rather handsome bark of dark gray-black, in distinctive square, scaly blocks.

**Norway spruce *Picea abies* 18-24" 4-year seedlings & 12-18" 2-2-year transplants**

Fastest growing spruce to 40'-75' and a spread of 25-30'. Dense, dark 1" green needles. Thrives well in average soil conditions but prefers moderately moist, well drained soil to maintain its deep green color. One of the best conifers for shelters and windbreaks. Branches droop gracefully as tree matures, providing a beautiful specimen tree. Provides winter cover for deer, small game and birds, plus it is a good roosting tree for hawks and owls.



**Eastern white pine *Pinus strobus* 12-18" 2-2 transplants only this year.**

Fast growing from 50-100' with a spread of about 40'. While it likes full sun it can tolerate some shade and humidity. Grows in normal moisture conditions but can tolerate wet, swampy or dry areas. Soft green-blue needles. Very majestic, graceful and distinctive evergreen with high ornamental value as a specimen, for naturalizing, windbreaks or dense screen. Makes a beautiful sheared hedge. Easily transplanted due to a wide and moderately deep root system. White pine seeds are favored by black bears, rabbits, red squirrels, and many birds, especially red crossbills.



- Bluebird (\$27.50/1 or \$75/3) and 2-chambered bat boxes (\$35/1 or \$65/2) are available for examination &/or purchase year round at the District office .
- Rain Barrels may also be available for \$50/barrel on the day of pickup.
